- When the Clu Crew encourage Sandy in her God-given abilities, they quote Psalm 139:14 which says that we are fearfully and wonderfully made.
- As the Clu Crew reflects on the their case, Bonnie says, “do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves.” (Phillippians 1:2)

Today's adventure was full of lessons that teach us how to come closer to Jesus and live by His Word. Here are 3 discussion topics that will help connect the story to your daily life:

1. This episode explores the effects of envy, when people are overcome with jealousy. Do you remember a time when you were jealous of someone? How did you handle that?
2. After Doris confesses her wrongdoing, Sandy is feeling down about her talents and the Clu Crew comforts her. What talents has God given you? How do you use them to glorify Him?
3. This episode features a pie-eating contest and a character cheats in order to win. Have you ever cheated in order to win or succeed? What does this episode teach you about how you should confess?
