- In that same conversation, Bonnie reminds us that “If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where would be the smelling? But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased.” (1 Corinthians 12:17-18).

Today's adventure was full of lessons that teach us how to come closer to Jesus and live by His Word. Here are 3 discussion topics that will help connect the story to your daily life:

1. When the Clu Crew, Derek, and Ricky play basketball, Ricky makes fun of Abby for her asthma. Have you ever been made fun of? How did you handle that?
2. The Clu Crew's investigation reveals that Frank, the condo owner, vandalized the basketball court to make his own property look better. Why did he do it? Why is it wrong to destroy other people's property?
3. The Clu Crew spend a lot of today's episode playing outside and enjoying God's creation. What is an fun, outside activity that you could do to enjoy the blessing of your environment?
